Our School

CES has an enrolment of just over 340 students in grades K-6 with a professional and support staff of over 45 dedicated individuals which include:

- 23 professional staff, including Phys. Ed, Music and Resource specialists.
- The shared services of a Literacy Leader, Technology Leader, Speech/Language Pathologist, Psychologist and Social Worker.
- Support staff of Educational Assistants, Secretary, Library Technicians, Custodial Staff, and the shared services of a Computer Technician.
- Carman Elementary School (CES) welcomed two new teachers, two new Educational Assistants, and many new families over the past school year. We also welcomed three teacher candidates from the University of Manitoba and Brandon University.
- We congratulate the following teachers on their new positions:
 - Mrs. Pierrepont with Portage La Prairie School Division.
 - Mr. Coates with a permanent teaching position at Roland Elementary School.
 - Hayley Minty, from Roland Elementary, as our new grade 1 teacher.
 - Amanda Rheault, from Carman Collegiate, as our new grade 6 teacher.
 - Christan Froese as our new permanent teacher, teaching grade 2 this fall.
- Our school operates on a Balanced School Day schedule, with three 100 minute teaching blocks broken up with two nutrition and activity breaks.
- A Nursery School for 3 & 4 year olds operates out of the school. Also a Before & After School Program through Wee Care Child Centre is partnered with our school.
- We have a very active Advisory Council for School Leadership who run our milk and lunch programs and who support many programs for our children, including the incredible playground revitalization project which is nearing completion.
- Many parents and community members volunteer their time at our school.
- There is active use of our facilities by community programs with a focus on children: Taekwondo, Dance, Carman Resource Center Family Nights, Baseball, Gardening Club etc.

Highlights for the Year

Student success is key in all that we do at Carman Elementary School. During the 2015-2016 school year, we have seen the students grow in their academics, fitness, and citizenship. We strive to develop the whole child through varied lessons and activities.

Penner collaborated with the Administration and Student Services team to develop a plan to support literacy success at Carman Elementary. Personal health and fitness are essential to developing strong minds and bodies. At Carman Elementary, students work toward attaining their personal best at all times. Our Physical Education Specialist, Mr. Stobbe, teaches the children to try their best and work to build on what they can already attain. Building citizenship in our students through respecting ourselves, others and the world can be seen on a daily basis. Our students are extremely thoughtful, giving, and caring! In the past little while, we have had student initiated fundraisers for Cancer Care, Fort MacMurray, and the Alzheimer's Society. In collaboration with Carman Collegiate teacher, Mr. Lang, our grade 3 students have created a raised garden in the front of the school. They have connected with their pen pals (local seniors) and the community day cares and asked them to pull a weed and a vegetable this summer!
