Counsellor's Corner



In our Grades 4, 5, and 6 classes, we have heard reports from a number of students with concerns about **Kik**, an instant-messaging app for mobile phones.

As with all social media, it is important for kids and parents to talk about safe usage. Here are some specific details about Kik that would be good to talk about:

- 1. Kik accounts are totally **anonymous** and **unverified**. This means that it is very easy for people to create fake accounts.
 - 2. Kik supposedly requires users to be 13 or older, but since it is unverified, many users are underaged.
 - 3. Because of its anonymity, there have been a number of high-profile stories in the news about adult predators using Kik to prey on children.
 - 4. Many of the "users" on Kik are actually "bots" (computer programs) instead of people. These range from bots that legitimate websites and companies use to advertise to more scary bots that try to deceive users to visit pornographic and phishing websites.

The Wikipedia page for Kik (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Kik_Messenger) has good information and references to some of the dangerous usage of Kik.

This weekend is three weeks since our school community learned about the death of Mrs. Boda. Last Friday's memorial assembly was a meaningful way for our students and staff to remember her. After the service, many students and staff had the chance to cry together – for many of us, our emotions came out more on Friday than they had before.

This is a good reminder that **grief** can last a long time, and everyone experiences it differently. There are a number of *normal* aspects of grief that your students (especially those who were close to Mrs. Boda) might be experiencing in the coming weeks:



- denial
- emotional numbing
- · anger, irritability, and episodic rage
- fear and rushes of anxiety (pangs)
- confusion
- difficulty sleeping
- · regressive behaviors

- physical complaints such as "stomachaches" or headaches
- changes in appetite (overeating or lack of interest in food)
- transient visual or auditory misperceptions of the loved one's image or voice

Getting there:


- 1. Go to kidsintheknow.ca/parents.
